PRESIDENT OF SOUTHAMPTON HOSPITAL FOUNDATION
AND CHIEF DEVELOPMENT OFFICER
AT STONY BROOK SOUTHAMPTON HOSPITAL

I recently had the opportunity to catch up with Julia McCormack, president of Southampton Hospital Foundation and chief development officer at Stony Brook Southampton Hospital. Stony Brook Southampton Hospital is the sole provider of emergency care on Long Island's South Fork. With 124 beds, the hospital is staffed by more than 280 physicians, dentists, and allied health professionals representing 48 medical specialties. Southampton Hospital Foundation's fundraising initiatives support Stony Brook Southampton Hospital and its mission of expanding access to exceptional health care throughout our community.

Tell us a little bit about your background.

I am a native of New York City, and I spent my summers in Southampton with my family while growing up. My career has focused on nonprofit fundraising, and I have held director positions for both the Major Gifts and Leadership Gifts teams at New York's Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, as well as at the Conquer Cancer Foundation (formerly known as the ASCO Foundation), and Miss Porter's School in Farmington, Connecticut.

As a Southampton resident, what does it mean to you to make a difference in your backyard?

Working with the entire community to ensure medical access for everyone on the South Fork for generations to come is perhaps the most meaningful role I will have the opportunity to participate in during my career. Having the chance to serve my own community at Stony Brook Southampton Hospital and Southampton Hospital Foundation in this way is deeply meaningful to me. I am pleased to do so alongside Emily Mastaler, M.A., M.B.A., who recently joined Stony Brook Southampton Hospital as chief administrative officer.

The foundation's summer outreach program is quite robust. What do you have planned, and what highlights can we expect?

Our biggest fundraiser, the 66th annual Summer Party, will take place on Saturday, August 3. As the longest-running gala in the Hamptons, we will embrace our legacy while envisioning our future under the tents at Wickapogue Road in Southampton. Elena A. Ford and Sarah Wetenhall will serve as co-chairs, with Hollis Forbes, Sheila Fuchs, Jean Shafiroff, Melanie Wambold, Cindy Willis, and Joey Wölffer as vicechairs. We are pleased to have Rachel Zoe as fashion chair. Nancy Stone is the corporate-partnership chair, and Gregory D'Elia, Norah Lawlor, and Lisa Tamburini will serve as public-

Auctioneer extraordinaire Lydia Fenet will once again take center stage to raise essential funds.

We're hosting our fourth annual East Hampton Emergency Department Luncheon at Maidstone Club on Thursday, July 11. Our guest speaker, beauty icon Bobbi Brown, will participate in a conversation moderated by BookHampton owner Carolyn Brody. Jill Davis, Kate Davis, Hollis Forbes, Liz Lange, and Mary Margaret Trousdale will co-chair. The Stony Brook Medicine East Hampton Satellite Emergency Department is currently under construction and is set to be finished in the fall of 2024, with an anticipated opening in early 2025. It launched with Isaac Boots, who led his Torch'd by Isaac Boots fitness experience on Saturday, June 22, out at the wine stand at Wölffer Estate Vineyard. The series will conclude on Saturday, August 10, with DanceBody at their studio in Bridgehampton.

We will commemorate the end of summer at the Hampton Classic, which has supported the hospital for over 40 years.
